Hot Nail



Hot Nail was created for the treatment of improperly placed nails. It can also be used as an effective treatment of thrush, sterilizing the white line and for tender footed horses.

Directions:

To treat an improperly placed nail:

- Remove the nail or nails in question
- Insert the bottle's nozzle into the nail hole and squeeze gently.
- Repeat as necessary.



Start with a clean and dry hoof.

- Gently insert the bottle's nozzle into the thrush site and carefully squeeze in hot nail thoroughly saturating the affected area.
- Repeat this process at least 3 times a week.
- It may be helpful to place cotton on the affected frog, saturate it with Hot Nail, then use a hoof pick to gently press the cotton into the area affected with thrush.

For tender footed horses:

- 1. Make sure the hoof is clean and dry.
- Apply the product 2 hours before any competition or use.
- Apply Hot Nail solution to the entire sole of the hoof.
- Reapply the solution every 15 minutes for approximately 2 hours.

This product can be applied to the white line to cauterize and sterilize a suspicious white line.

Do not apply Hot Nail on or above the coronary band. If it is accidentally applied or spilled above coronary band, clean it thoroughly with soap and water, and rub in a soothing lotion or petroleum jelly to prevent irritation.
